

IA Adopt a Backpack Benefiting the

Woodrow Peace Pantry

We are asking all IA families to "Adopt a Backpack" and help the PEACE PANTRY. The PEACE PANTRY is an organization that operates out of Woodrow Wilson High School that helps students who are enrolled and attending school, but find themselves homeless, or without a consistent and comfortable living situation. During the week these students have access to food while at school, but are often without the means to have access to food on the weekends. The Peace Pantry provides these students with food and toiletries to help them sustain a weekend.

The "Adopt A Backpack" event is a great way to teach your children how to give back. We are asking all IA families to pick up a backpack from the school office and fill it with items from your own pantry, or the store. We have 250 backpacks to fill! Below is a list of items that the PEACE PANTRY encourages families to donate:

- o Foods high in protein such as canned meats (i.e., tuna, chicken, salmon) and canned or dried beans
- o Foods high in nutrients, such as canned fruits and vegetables (preferably with reduced sodium and reduced sugar)
- o Whole-grain foods such as brown rice, whole grain cereal and whole-wheat pasta
- o Soups, chilies and stews (preferably with reduced sodium and reduced fat)
- o 100 percent fruit juice (canned, plastic or boxed)
- o Beef Jerky, crackers, ravioli, granola bars, Mac and cheese cups, trail mix, nuts
- o And other nutritious, "healthy-choice" foods (preferably with reduced fat, sodium and sugar)

All backpacks should be returned to the IA office by Friday, November 20th! Each student that returns a backpack will be given a fun sticker!


IAPA Holiday Pop-Up Shop

CURRICULUM CORNER

Toddlers

We hope you are starting to see your little ones use their sign language words for Eat, Drink, More, Thank You and All Done! We will continue to use these signs for the month of November and will also be repeating our theme Where Are...? in Baby Doll Circle Time to reinforce the routine of the curriculum. Repetition is the key for this age group! This month we will paint with the colors orange and brown, work on fine motor skills, sing and dance.

Pre-K 2

Colors, Colors! This month we will explore the science and beauty of colors. We will review our favorite colors with a focus on yellow, red, orange, blue, green, black and white. We will get to wear these colors to school the last day of every week! We will practice sorting by color, look for colors in nature and dance with colored streamers. You can reinforce colors at home by finding objects around the house, or on the way to school that are our colors for the week. Our letters this month are H, I, J & K and our numbers are 5 & 6.

<u> Pre-K 3</u>

This month our theme is Being Thankful and Harvest. We will go to visit the Farmer's Market on Thursday, November 12th & Friday, November 13th. Please join us if you can! Our focus for the month is how to hold our crayons, rhyming, riddles, sorting by size and the colors red, green and yellow. Look for our Aim & Scribble sheets to come home which help us focus on holding our crayons. Our letters for the month are G, S, J, D & P.

Pre-K 4

This month we will explore Families and Social Behavior. We will discuss how families are alike and different, the needs of families, how we can communicate with our families and recognizing our family members' feelings. Ask us to show you our breathing techniques we have learned! Our letters for the month are W, T, A & D. We will also take a trip to the Heritage Museum on Thursday, November 12th or Friday, November 13th.

Kindergarten

Our Social Studies theme for the month is Pilgrims and Native Americans, with a focus on the Indian tribe, Wampanoag. We will be practicing our songs and finger plays for our performance at the Thanksgiving Feast on Tuesday, November 24th. We are working on short vowel sounds, pointing to words as we read out loud, and starting the mechanics of writing by using capital letters, spacing, subjects and verbs in our sentences. Our sight words are *one, two, three, little, big, run* and *away*. Look for these sight words when reading our favorite books!
